He has also written regularly for *The Economist, The Guardian, The South China Morning Post,* the *Irish Times* and the BBC as well as a wide range of other international and academic publications.

He is currently working on a new book, Global Emergency: why democracy has reached its limits, which will be published in early 2020.


A Chicken Can't Lay a Duck Egg: How Covid-19 Can Solve The Climate Crisis

Rather than viewing the current economic slowdown as a problem, societies should see it as the greatest chance for a radical change in decades.

Instead of bailing-out polluting firms, governments should take the chance to close them. Rather than boosting economic growth, societies should downsize and build a new economic system, that can coexist with nature. Governments should introduce a basic income for all and retrain people to work in the sectors which will be needed: materials recovery, emissions capture, repairing, sharing, and recycling. To pay for this, they can print money, just as they did after the 2008 crash. The risk of bankruptcy will be much easier to handle than runaway climate change.

Covid-19 also gives nations a unique opportunity to work together, to create a more sustainable future for everyone. It is the only way they will eradicate the virus and respond to climate change effectively. Whatever happens, the failures of the current economic system, the impact of climate change, and the planet's other environmental troubles will force radical change on societies soon, whether they want it or not.

Covid-19 offers humanity the chance to choose a better path.



His thoughts on modern economics

Wrong-headed economic thinking is behind many of the big challenges we face.

Because societies focus on output growth, they use more resources and energy each year. This creates more CO_2 , the major cause of climate change. Modern economic thinking is also behind the rise in inequality, today's extreme individualism and the weakening of many democratic principles. It is the cause of over-population. It has even warped our ideas of charity, social responsibility and progress.



There is a better way. Without change, we risk system collapse. Our climate problems will worsen, with the risk of runaway change that we will be unable to stop. Poverty, conflict and inequality will grow. In much of the world hopes for development will not be met and businesses prospects will stall. Maxton believes that there is a better way. He shows that we can solve these problems, improve living standards and make businesses properly green – and a part of the solution. He shows how we can put ourselves, our societies, and nature back at the core of all our thinking.
